



GHCFRW Meeting Minutes

November 19, 2024

Ronnye Cowell, Recording Secretary



President Tina Gibson called the meeting to order at 10:05 AM.

The prayer and pledges were led by GHC Chaplain, Alicia Cantrell.

President Gibson recognized two elected officials in attendance at today's meeting:Representative Lacey Hull and Piney Point Mayor Aliza Dutt. She also thanked the Waller County RW club for providing the breakfast and refreshments for today's meeting.

1st Vice President, Buckley Morlot introduced the guest speakers for today's program. First, we heard from political consultant Dr. Jacquie Baly who spoke about the 2024 election results. She shared information about trends she has been seeing with Republican voters and pointed out demographic voter turnout changes occurring in races in Texas, Harris County, and Fort Bend County. Dr. Baly pointed out this is the 1st time in 132 years that the Rio Grande Valley in Texas voted Republican. The second speaker was Representative Lacey Hull who was recently reelected for her 3rd term in Texas House district 138. Representative Hull spoke to members about the 89th Legislative Session which will begin on January 14th. She mentioned priorities for this legislative session being School Choice and School Funding and then spoke about legislation she is working on for the upcoming session and the committees she works with in the legislature.

Members were able to ask questions of both speakers and the information they provided to members was enlightening and painted a positive outlook for the future of conservatives in Texas.

Business Meeting

Vice President Amy Byers conducted the roll call of Member Clubs. Amy also mentioned the Original Nuts 'n Bolts will be held on February 18th. The cost will be \$30 per person. Members can pay with a check, cash, or credit card. She needs forms completed so she has a head count of which sessions members wish to attend. This year, we will have 3 meeting rooms which allows members to get more material and training for club members.

Recording Secretary, Ronnye Cowell, asked for any additions or corrections for the minutes from the September GHC meeting. There were none given. A motion was made to accept the minutes as written by Sophia Mafrige and seconded by Marga Matthews. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Lois Gremminger presented the Treasurer's report. For the month of October 1-31, we had a beginning balance of \$17,863.28. Total income was \$2,596.40 and expenses were \$962.45. This leaves us with a current balance of \$19,497.23. The Treasurer's report was approved as presented.

President Gibson pointed out that we have so much to celebrate with our election results from November 5th. There are a few recounts going on right now in Ft. Bend and Brazoria Counties. She thanked members for the Camp Hope donations which were collected as members signed in this morning. Tina asked for any member who was recognized at the TFRW Tribute to Women in October to please stand and be recognized. 2025 is a training year with TFRW and Nuts n Bolts will be our training for members in February. The cost is \$30 if paying by check and \$32 if paying by credit card.

President Gibson announced that GHC has a few officer vacancies for this next year. 3rd Vice President for Special Events, 4th Vice President Finance and Historian will need to be appointed for 2025. If anyone is interested in being on the board, please let her know. There will be a nominating committee elected at the September meeting to present an officer slate for election in November for the next terms and this could be a good way to learn more about GHC and get involved.

1st Vice President Buckley Morlot recognized and thanked Waller County RW President and Veteran Dani Post with a special pin. Danny served in the Army. Buckley asked if there were any new members in attendance at today's meeting. There being none, she asked who traveled the farthest. Renee Lunsford traveled 2 hours and was given a gift card. Buckley then went through some Texas trivia to give our more door prizes to those who knew the answer: Which US President was born in Texas? What is known as the 8th wonder of the world? And what is the official mammal of Texas? Program is being worked on for January and information will come out when they have been finalized.

Corresponding Secretary, Susie Cintron is beginning to work on the President's Book with Amy Byers for the Nuts n Bolts in February.

Renee Lunsford, Legislative Chair, spoke about the advantages of being a member of GHC and a TFRW club. Networking with women across Texas and the USA, learning from speakers and getting to know and meet candidates. She mentioned the upcoming Legislative Day with TFRW in March where members can learn how to get engaged int eh Legislative process. She encouraged members to attend this in March. President Gibson pointed out the date of Legislative Day will be March 20th. Cost of the AT&T Center Hotel will be high, but she hopes many members will attend.

President Gibson thanked Newsletter editor, Laura Carlson on a fabulous newsletter. She spotlighted each of our club members who were recognized at the TFRW Tribute to Women and put each of their photos in the newsletter.

Historian SJ Swanson gave away a printed copy of the newsletter that Laura created. She spoke about the importance of passing down history. She and Dana Kahn met with Jo Konan past President of GHC from 1993-94. Mrs. Conan donated her President's notebook to GHC and shared information about things that had occurred during her time as GHC President. One being a luncheon with 1st Lady Barbara Bush that was held for members of GHC.SJ encouraged members to have their clubs donate items so we can preserve and pass down all the wonderful things that have occurred in GHC over its history.

SJ reported on January 1st, Harris County Judges will be sworn in at 11:00 AM at the 1910 Courthouse. The public is welcome to attend but no politicking may occur in the courthouse. Fort Bend will have their judges sworn in at noon on January 1st. In the 2026 election, there will be 72 Judicial candidates on the ballot. She encouraged members to contact their county chair if they are interested in running for an office.

TFRW will be publishing a book for their 70th anniversary and President Tina Gibson and Historian SJ Swanson have been working on writing a section on Greater Houston Council. The book will be sold at the TFRW Convention in October 2025.

Hospitality Chair Joyce Chambers thanked Waller County RW for providing breakfast and snacks for this morning's meeting. Their buffet display honors Veterans and include a replica of the Tomb to the Unknown Soldier. Please let Joyce know if your club is interested in bringing refreshments next year.

President Gibson announced that Wendy Lojo came and left during our meeting. She is the new District Director for Senator Joan Huffman.

Announcements:

- Ronnye Cowell announced that TFRW will reduce the cost of Legislative Day due to the cost of the host hotel and other hotels being up for attendees.
- Fort Bend RW will be celebrating their 50th Anniversary on December 4th. Other dates are on the calendar. If you want to attend the Inauguration in Washington DC, contact your congressman.
- · Our next meeting will be January 21st.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:47 AM.




